Thank you for staying the journey with us!



## "Challenging but pleasant"

Our experience supporting our daughter's learning during the CB was quite challenging. However, we managed to make HBL quite interesting and beneficial for her. HBL also enabled our child to continue learning despite the CB measures. I personally felt that HBL created a way of learning which taught my child discipline and punctuality.

The main challenges we encountered were how to spend time meaningfully with our children and encourage them to do their learning independently. We also realized that the screen time increased during this period which put a strain on our daughter's eyes so we had to find ways to help her manage this.

Since we strongly believed in the importance of our daughter's learning, we continued to encourage her to take HBL seriously. Occasionally, we would give our daughter surprise gifts to cheer her up and alleviate her stress levels. On the whole, I would say that our experience of HBL was a pleasant one despite some of the challenges we faced.

### "Different but meaningful"

During HBL, I managed my time by coming up with a schedule so that I would not get confused. At first, I had trouble coping with the lessons as full-time online learning was a new experience for me. I had trouble understanding a few things. However, as time went by, I got used to HBL and was able to cope with my lessons better. I set reminders on my laptop to remind myself to go for short breaks so that I could relax my eyes.

I felt that the whole experience was different and meaningful. I learnt to be more responsible and independent. I think in the future, I would definitely be able to handle HBL if the situation arises! I know what to expect and I am equipped with the skills to handle it.

In June, then Minister for Education Mr Ong Ye Kung mentioned that students, teachers and parents went through "an unexpected crash course" in HBL. I think all of us will agree that it was truly a period of adjustment and of learning. From my conversations with parents during the Parent Teacher Conference in July, I could tell how concerned they were about their children's learning as well as their socio-emotional well-being. I believe the focus for everyone during this period was technology and how it could be harnessed for teaching and learning.

Full-HBL was a great opportunity for me to learn how I could utilize technology to support my pupils' learning. Granted it was quite a feat at first, trying to integrate and transfer our existing syllabus into an online platform (i.e. SLS). However, with time and with the support of colleagues, I was able to find my bearings. I was moved by the camaraderie amongst my colleagues as we tried to help one another navigate the Student Learning Space platform.

It was also encouraging to see the effort that the pupils were putting in to complete their online lessons. HBL also reminded us that not all children learn the same way. Some pupils mentioned that they enjoyed the HBL experience since they could pace themselves and determine when they were ready to learn. Others mentioned that it was not as fun as being in school because they could not interact with their peers and they were also unable to clarify problems immediately.

Although we experienced challenges during the full-HBL period, I do believe we have come out from this experience more equipped to tackle online learning. HBL may be here to stay and it is important that we continue to support our students so that they can navigate the digital future.
